Successful completion of the course will lead to qualified teacher status (QTS) and you will be awarded a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) validated by our partner Higher Education Institute and accredited provider, University of Chester.

Eligibility Criteria

You must have achieved:

- Degree 2.1 or above (2:2 may be accepted for some shortage subjects)
- GCSE (or equivalent) Grade C/4 or above in Maths and English

Degree

If your degree subject does not link closely to the subject you intend to teach, you may be eligible to access a Subject Knowledge Enhancement (SKE) course.

Subject Knowledge

Your level of subject knowledge will be assessed through your application and at interview. We will decide if it is necessary for you to complete a SKE and it will be a condition on your offer. SKE's are only available in shortage subjects

A-Levels in the subject you wish to teach are desirable, especially if your Degree does not relate to that subject

What we are looking for candidates who:

- Have empathy and understanding of the demands of teaching in the secondary classroom
- Enjoy working with young people and see teaching as a wider professional duty
- Have confidence in presenting in front of teenagers
- High quality graduates who may bring transferable skills and experience from previous careers
- Are willing and able to commit the time to the training programme, which will include academic assignments and study
- We also want candidates who are keen to be involved in the wider pastoral and extra -curricular life of our schools and who can give the time to this during their training year

How trainees are selected

- Applications must be submitted via the DfE Apply portal
- Applications will be reviewed against a set of selection criteria looking at experience and qualifications
- If your application does not meet the criteria and you have been unsuccessful in securing an Interview, you will be notified via the DfE portal
- Successful candidates will be invited for an Interview with a small panel including a subject specialist
- The interview will include a subject knowledge presentation and formal interview. Details of the presentation will be sent to you in advance of the interview

The Programme

Trainees will complete a total of 180 days of training between September and July. A minimum of 120 days will be in the classroom, observing and building up to whole class teaching as soon as possible. The structure of our programme allows trainees to be quickly immersed in the practicalities of teaching; resulting in a more confident and competent teacher.

Over the duration of the programme you will experience:

- Two contrasting school placements
- Sixth Form Experience
- Primary School Experience
- 10 days centre based Professional Training delivered by expert practitioners
- Regular Academic Learning and support from University of Chester
- Complete two PGCE assignments
- Access to Subject Development resources

What support can I expect?

In both placements you will be supported by:

- A subject specialist mentor
- A school professional tutor, who will oversee all trainee teachers hosted by your placement school
- A university based subject tutor
- The Salop Teaching Partnership team

Where will I carry out my school placements?

You will be placed at any one of our partner schools within the Shropshire and Telford and Wrekin area.

We will take into consideration your circumstances, however, you will need to take into consideration travel time and distances that may be involved. We endeavor to ensure that travel times are reasonable.



Funding your training

Our PGCE Lead School Partner Route ITE programme is fee funded. All tuition fees must be paid by the Trainee.

There is a package of Government bursaries and scholarships available for shortage subjects which you may be entitled to.

You may also be entitled to support from Student Finance, such as tuition fee and maintenance loans.

Safer Recruitment

We are committed to safer recruitment and as such will carry out the following checks as part of our recruitment process:-

- Provide a full history of employment/ education including an explanation of any gaps.
- Verification of identity, including any change of name.
- Minimum of 2 references (1 academic, and 1 professional). We may ask for further references.
- Online checks of publicly available information
- DBS Certificate via University of Chester

How Do I Apply?

Submission of application

All applications for teacher training are managed by a single application process with the Department for Education https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-teacher-training

Our Provider Code is 1Q6 (Salop Teaching Partnership)

You will be able to track the progress of your applications through the Apply portal.

Interviews

Interviews for the coming academic year will be held between October and July. We will contact you and invite you for interview and will give you at least 1 week's notice.

Decisions following interview

Following selection and interview, offers will be made to applicants within 40 days of their application being received. Conditional offers will be subject to degree results and proof of qualifications, Enhanced DBS check and successful completion of a SKE, if required.
